Andrea Cooper is serving in Santa Cruz, Bolivia. She is in her third year of teaching at a local elementary school which enrolls both native and foreign students. Although the school is Christian in nature, many of the families who send their children to the school are not. Medical care is a door opener for Covenant missionary Cindy Hoover who has invited a number of communities to use medicine for mission through a program called "Semillas de Salud" (Seeds of Health). Hoover has spent much time in the isthmus region of Oaxaca training local church members to do screening tests for diabetes and hypertension and to work with them on how to initiate health ministries in their own communities. Wally directs the efforts of Serenity Seekers in Wichita, Kansas. While based upon the twelve-step program model, Serenity Seekers is unashamedly Christian in nature, looking to Jesus as the source of strength. The group uses a Serenity Bible to walk through each "step" with scripture references that encourage honest interaction while uncovering the reality of our sin, the hope of reconciliation with others, and the promise of peace in Christ.
